## **RE-ESTABLISHMENT RESOLUTION PROCESS** for College Panhellenic Council

- The NPC member organization brings a reestablishment resolution proposal to the College Panhellenic Council.
- The College Panhellenic notifies the NPC Panhellenic area advisor
- A motion is made by a delegate to approve the proposed resolution at a council meeting.
- Details of the motion. including who made and seconded the motion. are recorded in the meeting minutes.

## • The Panhellenic community is given adequate time (one to two weeks) to review the proposed

- resolution with their chapters, advisors and inter/national representatives. The College Panhellenic may make suggestions for revisions to the member organization before voting.
- The Panhellenic delegates vote on the resolution at the next council meeting.
- Potential outcomes of the vote include:
  - Vote passes
  - Vote does not pass
- The outcome of the vote is noted on the re-establishment resolution and each delegate voting in the affirmative signs the resolution.
- The vote must be detailed in the minutes including the outcome (passed/not passed), number of chapters voting in favor and number of chapters opposed. Each chapter should be listed with their vote.
- The minutes are distributed and sent to the NPC area advisor.

## ANNUAL DISCUSSION

- Annual discussion with the College Panhellenic Council should be initiated by the NPC member organization.
- The fraternity/sorority advisor may represent the College Panhellenic.
- Conversation topics may include current campus conditions and trends.
- The discussion should result in a mutual decision to renew. edit, terminate, or implement the re-establishment agreement.
- The outcome of the annual discussion should be shared at the next College Panhellenic meeting, noted in the minutes and sent to the NPC area advisor
