# 2023 National Panhellenic Conference Foundation Scholarship Recipients Announced

\$4,000 Awarded to Sorority Women to Help Fund Higher Education

# Alpha Phi/Betty Mullins Jones Scholarship

Maggie Simons, Alpha Gamma Delta, is the recipient of the Alpha Phi/Betty Mullins Jones Scholarship established by the Alpha Phi Foundation to honor Betty Mullins Jones' commitment to the National Panhellenic Conference. This scholarship is awarded annually to a collegiate Panhellenic woman who has worked to further her fraternal community's reputation on her campus and who embodies the values of sisterhood, philanthropy and scholarship. This \$1,000 scholarship is awarded to a woman who makes a difference in sorority life by serving on her College Panhellenic.

Simons is pursuing a degree in chemical engineering, and pursuing minors in biochemistry & pre-law at Kettering University, and will be attending law school to specialize in Intellectual Property. Maggie is an active leader in her chapter, serving as the vice president of new member experience, as well as various other activities on her campus, including serving as a desk resident assistant.

# Carole Jurenko Jones Scholarship

Madison Ring, Delta Phi Epsilon, is the recipient of the Carole Jurenko Jones Scholarship, established by Alpha Omicron Pi. This \$1,000 scholarship honors Carole Jurenko Jones' commitment to the National Panhellenic Conference, including serving as NPC chairman during the 2017-19 and 2019-21 bienniums. This scholarship is awarded annually to a collegiate member in good standing of an NPC member organization who has served in a chapter or Panhellenic leadership role. It also may be awarded to an alumna in good standing who demonstrates Panhellenic spirit, outstanding service and leadership to her campus or community.

Ring attends Nova Southeastern University and is studying dance and pre-health. She has served on her Panhellenic Council's executive board previously as the vice president of programming and is currently serving as the president.

#### Mary Louise Roller Scholarship

Sara Ringenbach, Delta Zeta, is the recipient of the Mary Louise Roller Scholarship. This scholarship was funded originally by a grant from Alpha Omicron Pi in honor of Mrs. Roller's 33-year tenure on Alpha Omicron Pi's Panhellenic delegation. The Mary Louise Roller Scholarship is a \$1,000 scholarship and will be awarded to an undergraduate woman who plans to attend graduate school the following fall. Each recipient shall display outstanding service to her local College Panhellenic during her undergraduate years. Each College Panhellenic may nominate one candidate per year.

Ringenbach is a May 2023 graduate from Muhlenberg College where she majored in biochemistry & public health. She will be attending medical school at Lewis Katz School of Medicine at St. Luke's Bethlehem.

# Sigma Kappa Courage and Conviction Scholarship

Kayla Lauver, Alpha Sigma Tau, is the recipient of the Sigma Kappa Courage and Conviction Scholarship. This scholarship award was funded by Sigma Kappa in honor of Donna Crain King's service as NPC chairman during the 2015-17 biennium. It is a \$1,000 scholarship awarded annually. The scholarship is awarded to a collegiate or alumna member in good standing of a Panhellenic organization who has achieved a minimum 3.0 GPA, displayed significant service or contributions to her chapter, university or community at large, and demonstrated noteworthy "courage and conviction."

Lauver is an undergraduate at James Madison University pursuing a degree in health services administration. She has served in various positions on her chapter's junior executive and executive board, and is currently serving as her chapter's president.
