- February is **Black History Month**: Find ways that your sorority community can actively participate, celebrate and recognize Black History Month. You can also learn more about Black History Month, its origins and why it is celebrated in February [here](#). Consider incorporating the following into your programming:
 - Invite a guest speaker to your College Panhellenic meeting to speak on a selected topic. For example, a professor from your African American Studies department on notable women in Black history.
 - Organize a book club. Reading notable works from Black authors can be a meaningful way for individuals to celebrate and recognize Black History Month.
 - Attend and promote Black History Month events on your campus and in your community. Share information about events with members and encourage chapters and sorority women to attend programs.
- February is also **NPC Month of the Scholar**:
 - Each year, NPC celebrates the Month of the Scholar in February to honor the core value of scholarship for every NPC member organization and College Panhellenic. We've developed [Month of the Scholar](#) and [Academic Excellence resources](#).

Registration for this new NPC program is available to access on FS Central now through March 15. College Panhellenic Delegate Orientation is NPC's dynamic, must-attend educational experience designed to empower chapter delegates with the latest Panhellenic insights and leadership tools. Each attendee will gain access to two sections: first, self-paced modules that will be available on demand and second, a live session, facilitated by an NPC expert, to allow for dialogue and discussion among chapter delegates. This session will focus on your specific community and relies on the buy-in of all your delegates to make lasting change in your community.

Save the Date!

For all College Panhellenic officers and fraternity/sorority advisors

The **College Panhellenic Awards** for 2025-26 will open in March! Award applications will remain open until the end of the day on May 1, 2026. The award categories are academic innovation, access, belonging and community impact, leadership, recruitment, marketing and operations.

In order to be eligible for College Panhellenic Awards:

- Adhere to NPC Unanimous Agreements and policies.
- Have paid 2025-26 NPC dues by Oct. 1, 2025.
- Have submitted its NPC Annual Report (all 4 sections) by the due date in 2026.
- Have uploaded a current copy of its governing documents (including bylaws and recruitment rules) in FS Central.
- Communicate regularly with and consult the NPC area advisor, including sending meeting minutes and governing documents.

The **College Panhellenic annual reports** for 2025-26 will go live in March and will be found in FS Central under your Panhellenic's profile, then under "reporting," and then under "submit reports."

There are four reports, and they can be saved intermittently before completion if necessary. All four reports must be complete by May 1 for award consideration. College Panhellenic Annual Reports are extremely helpful to NPC and other College Panhellenics. Annual report responses allow NPC to provide adequate resources to your College Panhellenic and understand larger trending concerns.

Recruitment tip of the month: Talking About "The Why"

Rather than memorizing talking points or focusing on surface-level facts, inspire members to practice sharing meaningful stories, why they joined, how they have grown and what their community truly means to them.
