New Unanimous Agreement and Policy Updates Going Into Effect During the 2026-27 Academic Year.

- In October and January, the National Panhellenic Conference (NPC) Council of Delegates added, removed and modified a number of Unanimous Agreements and policies.

- It is very important you update your bylaws to reflect these changes. You do NOT need to vote on the updated changes. Each College Panhellenic and Alumnae Panhellenic must incorporate the NPC Unanimous Agreements into its procedures and operating methods (bylaws, standing rules, membership recruitment rules and other governing documents).
- You can work with your area advisor to make updates and ensure you are following all Unanimous Agreements and policies.

College Panhellenic Awards

For all College Panhellenic officers

The College Panhellenic Awards for 2025-26 are open! Award applications will remain open until the end of the day on May 1 (11:59 p.m. Eastern).

The award categories are academic innovation, access, belonging and community impact, leadership, recruitment, marketing and operations.

Your College Panhellenic can apply for standalone awards in these categories, but in order to be eligible for the Excellence Award, one must apply to all six and be awarded all six.

In order to be eligible for College Panhellenic Awards your College Panhellenic must:

- Adhere to NPC Unanimous Agreements and policies.

- Have paid 2025-26 NPC dues by Oct. 1, 2025.
- Have submitted its NPC Annual Report (all four sections) by May 1.
- Have uploaded a current copy of its governing documents (including bylaws and recruitment rules) in FS Central.
- Communicate regularly with and consult the NPC area advisor, including sending meeting minutes and governing documents.

Tips to consider when applying for awards:

- Review the [success indicators](#) for each award.
- Delegate an award category to each officer.
- Be as detailed as possible.
- Review your answers with your area advisor.
- Practice submitting a fake award application. Have your Panhellenic advisor review your application to provide feedback.

Calendar Reminders

For all College Panhellenic officers

- April is **Sexual Assault Awareness Month**: NPC encourages College Panhellenic Associations and sorority women to lead and participate in initiatives to prevent, educate and ultimately end sexual violence on campus. We know that 1 in 4 college-aged women will experience some form of sexual violence while attending college, and many of you may have been affected personally or know others who have been. This month, please take time to care for yourself and those around you.
 - Not sure where to start? We suggest reviewing the [College Panhellenic Sexual Violence Assessment Implementation Guide](#). You can also use the [Community Sexual Violence Sample Assessment](#) to determine where, as a community, you should focus your advocacy, education and prevention efforts. NPC suggests using campus and community resources to tailor your approach.
- April is also **Advisor Appreciation Month**: This is a time to reflect on the advisors who inspire us in our sorority lives. Did your chapter advisor show you the meaning of lifelong membership? Thank her! Did your fraternity/sorority advisor show you the big Panhellenic picture? Thank them! Has your NPC area advisor guided you to help your Panhellenic make progress? Let them know! Apply for an Academic Excellence Programming Grant by May 15

For College Panhellenic presidents, programming and scholarship officers

Through a generous donation from Phi Mu Fraternity to create this fund, the NPC Foundation offers grants to College Panhellenics in support of creating a climate in which there is a constant presence and appreciation of academic excellence. We hope these grants will help you defray the cost of this programming and to be more creative in how you support academic pursuits of Panhellenic women on your campus. Applications for grants are accepted on a rolling basis with fall (Oct. 15) and

spring (May 15) review dates.

After the review committee meets, applicants will be notified in June and November, respectively. To be eligible the College Panhellenic must have paid NPC dues by Oct. 1, 2025 and have completed the prior year's Annual Reports in FS Central.
