



NPC Student Advocacy Fellowship

The Student Advocacy Fellowship program will support NPC's policy advocacy program by enlisting four to six collegiate Panhellenic women to actively engage lawmakers both in Washington, D.C., and in their home districts on topics related to NPC's [legislative agenda](#); assist in coaching other student, and alumnae, representatives to lobby on these topics; and consult on the development of relevant educational resources for College Panhellenic communities.

Position Duties:

- Provide a student voice to NPC's advocacy program
- Meet with a bipartisan slate of elected officials in Washington, DC and in-district multiple times a year to advance NPC's legislative agenda
- Serve as a leader of NPC's bipartisan student lobbying team to assist with training and development of other student lobbyists
- Assist with development of educational resources about advocacy and NPC's priorities for College Panhellenic communities
- Attend NPC College Panhellenic Academy to discuss legislative advocacy with College Panhellenic community leaders
- Engages in regular meetings with NPC staff to participate in relevant education and discuss priorities

Required Qualifications:

- A current collegiate member of one of the 26 NPC inter/national organizations who will not graduate prior to May 2027
- Interest and willingness to work with legislators with a wide range of political affiliations and beliefs
- Dynamic understanding of the American political system
- Ability to effectively communicate NPC's legislative priorities with various stakeholders
- Previous experience volunteering, interning or working in government relations, politics or for an elected leader
- Flexibility to travel to various locations (local, Indianapolis and Washington DC) three - five times during the 2026-27 Academic Year
